Information Request: IR0632

Dear Minister Fraser:

As you are likely aware, the Parliamentary Budget Officer (PBO) provides independent and non-partisan analysis to the Senate and to the House of Commons about matters related to the nation's finances and the economy, the estimates, certain other government documents, and the cost of proposals. In carrying out my mandate, I often require information held by government departments and Crown corporations and I am entitled to free and timely access – subject to limited exceptions – to such information under section 79.4 of the *Parliament of Canada Act*.

I am currently undertaking an analysis pursuant to paragraph 79.2(1)(e) of the *Parliament of Canada Act*, which mandates the PBO to estimate the financial cost of any proposal that relates to a matter over which Parliament has jurisdiction at the request of a committee of either a House or a joint committee of both Houses.

For this analysis, I am requesting direct and indirect expenses pertaining to the administration of C-13 (*An Act to amend the Official Languages Act, to enact the Use of French in Federally Regulated Private Businesses Act and to make related amendments to other Acts*), and related tax expenditures. Where possible please classify the costs by standard object and identify whether they are variable, fixed, or step-wise variable.

Specifically, any information relating to the funding that Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada will receive as part of the \$16 million allocated to four entities as part of the Modernization of the Official Languages Act (page 69 of the Economic and Fiscal Update 2021), including expected additional tasks, associated Full-Time Equivalent positions and associated costs. If costs are not available for any of these aspects, please include the cost of similar aspects in comparable policies that you have administered in the past. As well, please identify any anticipated capital costs associated with this programming.

With respect to the proposed Use of French in Federally Regulated Private Businesses Act:

- What regions will be subject to the Act?
- What industries will be subject to the Act?
- What share of locations would have to offer services in French?
- What staffing in what occupations is required to offer services in French at a location?
- What staffing in what occupations is required to allow employees to work and be supervised in French at a location?
- What costs are incurred by businesses for translations of communications, word instruments and computer systems?

Further, I am requesting direct and indirect expenses pertaining to the policy development and administration of the Francophone Immigration Strategy and the “The Action Plan for Official Languages – 2018-2023: Investing in Our Future”, and related tax expenditures. Where possible please classify the costs by standard object and identify whether they are variable, fixed, or step-wise variable.

Please include information such as tasks, associated Full-Time Equivalent positions and associated costs, as well as any related capital costs. Please delineate these costs by year (fiscal year or calendar year) of these policies.

In order to provide the analysis to parliamentarians in a timely manner, I ask the information to be provided to my office no later than **April 4th, 2022**. If access to the requested information cannot be granted by that date, a response must be provided by you or your deputy minister as soon as possible.

Attached is a reply form. It too should be filled out and returned by April 4th, 2022, whether or not you provide access to the requested information. Should you refuse to provide access to the requested information, you or your deputy minister must provide a written justification for the refusal as required under section 79.41 of the *Parliament of Canada Act*.

The response letter will be posted on the PBO website and, therefore, it should not be marked “confidential”. As well, the requested information should be attached separately. If this information is confidential, please clearly mark it as such, either on the electronic spreadsheet or the hard copy version.

Providing timely and effective analysis to the Senate and House of Commons and promoting greater budget transparency and accountability are the PBO’s primary objectives. The degree to which this is possible depends, to a large extent, on free and timely access to quality information held by

government departments. In doing so, you are assisting us in better serving the Senate, the House of Commons, and their members.
