Information Request: IR0641

Dear President Fortier:

As you are likely aware, the Parliamentary Budget Officer (PBO) provides independent and non-partisan analysis to the Senate and to the House of Commons about matters related to the nation's finances and the economy, the estimates, certain other government documents, and the cost of proposals. In carrying out my mandate, I often require information held by government departments and Crown corporations and I am entitled to free and timely access – subject to limited exceptions – to such information under section 79.4 of the *Parliament of Canada Act*.

I am currently undertaking an analysis pursuant to paragraph 79.2(1)(f) of the *Parliament of Canada Act*, which mandates the PBO to estimate the financial cost of any proposal that relates to a matter over which Parliament has jurisdiction at the request of a member of the Senate or of the House of Commons.

For this analysis, I am requesting information about persons who pay into or are receiving benefits through the:

- Public Service Superannuation Account
- Pension Plan for the Public Service of Canada
- Pension Plan for Federally Appointed Judges
- Pension Plan for Members of Parliament (please exclude those who do not have enough years of service to qualify for a pension)

For each of the groups above, please provide the following information for the 2020 and 2021 years. Please separate age groups by five years (ie. 20-24, 25-29, etc):

- Number of active member contributors, by age group and sex
- Number of current pensioners, by age group and sex
- Number of current survivors, by age group and sex

- Number of current survivors earning survivor benefits (and if not receiving benefits, why)

Information on marital status of the workers/pensioners and mortality rates for the 2020 and 2021 year, including:

- Marital status, by age group and sex
- Assumed mortality rates, by age group and sex

Information on the average annual pension and survivor benefit amount, by age group and sex.

Information on the current service cost as a percent of pensionable payroll for the 2020 and 2021 year.

Please note that we are also sending Information Requests to Statistics Canada and the Canada Revenue Agency, and have already sent requests to Veterans Affairs, the Department of National Defense and Public Services and Procurement. As such, if the information to complete sections of this request would require your department to coordinate with these other departments for information, it is not necessary to do so in this case.

In order to provide the analysis to parliamentarians in a timely manner, I ask the information to be provided to my office no later than **May 4<sup>th</sup>, 2022**. If access to the requested information cannot be granted by that date, a response must be provided by you or the secretary as soon as possible.



Attached is a reply form. It too should be filled out and returned by May 4<sup>th</sup>, 2022, whether or not you provide access to the requested information. Should you refuse to provide access to the requested information, you or the secretary must provide a written justification for the refusal as required under section 79.41 of the *Parliament of Canada Act*.

The response letter will be posted on the PBO website and, therefore, it should not be marked "confidential". As well, the requested information should be attached separately. If this information is confidential, please clearly mark it as such, either on the electronic spreadsheet or the hard copy version.

Providing timely and effective analysis to the Senate and House of Commons and promoting greater budget transparency and accountability are the PBO's primary objectives. The degree to which this is possible depends, to a large extent, on free and timely access to quality information held by government departments. In doing so, you are assisting us in better serving the Senate, the House of Commons, and their members.
