Dear Mr. Giroux:

On behalf of the Honourable Steven Guilbeault, Minister of Environment and Climate Change, and as requested by your office on November 28, 2022, please find attached one Excel file (Request IR0667 from PBO_v2.xlsx) containing the following information:

- Greenhouse gas emissions in each province and territory (and for Canada as a whole) by sector/industry over 2022 to 2030 under the regulatory scenario in the June 2022 Regulatory Impact Analysis of the *Clean Fuel Regulations* (CFR).
- Fuel use in each province and territory (and for Canada as a whole), by fuel type and by sector/industry, over 2022 to 2030 for the regulatory scenario.
- The impacts of the CFR on fuel prices for the period 2022–2030:
 - The impact of the CFR on the prices of gasoline and diesel; and
 - The impact of the CFR on the prices of biofuels and emerging energy, including biomass, solar power, geothermal energy, hydrogen, ethanol, biodiesel, and hydrogenation-derived renewable diesel.
- The economic impacts of the CFR in each province and territory (and for Canada as a whole) by sector for the period 2022–2030:
 - The impact of the CFR on real gross domestic product by province and by sector, as shown (for 2030 only) in tables 24 and 25 of the Regulatory Impact Analysis Statement of the *Clean Fuel Regulations* (SOR/2022-140); and
 - The corresponding impacts of the CFR on real (inflation-adjusted) investment (capital) and labour incomes, that is, the income components of gross domestic product.
