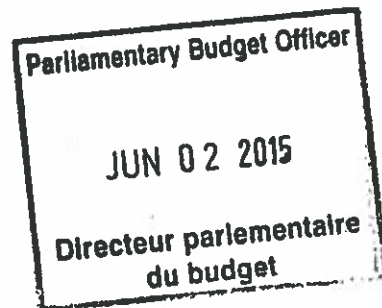

I am writing to you in response to your 26 March 2015 request for information IR0202 on the number of training and operational flying hours for fleets of CF-188, CP-140, CC-150T, CC-177, and CC-130J aircraft.

The total number of training/force generation (FG) and operational/force employment (FE) yearly flying rates for fiscal year 2014-15 are provided below.

- CF-188 Hornet: 7,310 hours (FG) and 5,813 hours (FE)
- CP-140 Aurora: 2,921 hours (FG) and 1,545 hours (FE)
- CC-150T Polaris: 807 hours (FG) and 2,174 hours (FE)
- CC-177 Globemaster: 404 hours (FG) and 3,020 hours (FE)
- CC-130J Hercules: 1,912 hours (FG) and 4,151 hours (FE)

The total number of operational flying hours flown to date for each type of aircraft associated with for Operation IMPACT is included below. There are no dedicated training hours for Operation IMPACT.

- CF-188 Hornet: 2,988.1 hours
- CP-140 Aurora: 1,225.6 hours
- CC-150T Polaris: 740.4 hours
- CC-150 Airbus: 130 hours
- CC-177 Globemaster: 1,182.9 hours
- CC-130J Hercules: 909.9 hours
- CC-130H/T Hercules: 48.9 hours

I would like to take this opportunity to reaffirm the Department of National Defence's commitment to provide you with access to the data to which you are entitled under the *Parliament of Canada Act*.
