Information Request: IR0795

Dear Minister Boissonnault:

As you are likely aware, the Parliamentary Budget Officer (PBO) provides independent and non-partisan analysis to the Senate and to the House of Commons about matters related to the nation's finances and the economy, the estimates, certain other government documents, and the cost of proposals. In carrying out my mandate, I often require information held by government departments and Crown corporations and I am entitled to free and timely access – subject to limited exceptions – to such information under section 79.4 of the *Parliament of Canada Act*.

I am currently undertaking an analysis pursuant to subparagraph 79.2(1)(c)(iv) of the *Parliament of Canada Act*, which mandates the PBO to undertake research on the nation's finances and economy at the request of the Standing Committee on Government Operations and Estimates of the House of Commons.

In accordance with the motion adopted by the Standing Committee on Government Operations and Estimates (OGGO) on March 18, 2024, I am requesting information on the attached list, compiled from the 2022-23 Public Accounts of companies with payments aggregating to \$100,000 or over relating to the informatics services classification of professional and special services.

For every company listed for which resources were used for a task-based informatics professional service, and where the individual consultant(s) were paid on a per diem basis and worked 200 or more days in 2022-23, please provide the following information for each relevant contract:

- category of consultant(s);
- per diem rate per consultant (\$);
- total days worked per consultant;
- number of consultants; and
- total contract value (\$).

In order to provide the analysis to parliamentarians in a timely manner, I ask the information to be provided to my office no later than **September 23rd, 2024**. If access to the requested information cannot be granted by that date, a response must be provided by you or your deputy minister as soon as possible.



Attached is a reply form. It too should be filled out and returned by September 23rd, 2024, whether or not you provide access to the requested information. Should you refuse to provide access to the requested information, you or your deputy minister must provide a written justification for the refusal as required under section 79.41 of the *Parliament of Canada Act*.

The response letter will be posted on the PBO website and, therefore, it should not be marked "confidential". As well, the requested information should be attached separately. If this information is confidential, please clearly mark it as such, either on the electronic spreadsheet or the hard copy version.

Providing timely and effective analysis to the Senate and House of Commons and promoting greater budget transparency and accountability are the PBO's primary objectives. The degree to which this is possible depends, to a large extent, on free and timely access to quality information held by government departments. In doing so, you are assisting us in better serving the Senate, the House of Commons, and their members.
